Pastor's Corner



I am very excited and can't stop praising God for this maiden issue of our Newsletter. Rejoice Bible Church endeavors to proclaim and teach the Word of God using various ways. We are introducing this newsletter as an instrument which will reach many people near and afar. We are committed to inform, update and educate our members and non-members about our programs and the Word of God. We also aim to lift each other up in various ways as we journey together in life as God's children.

We live in complex times where life sometimes throws challenges that lead to endless anxiety and can be stressful for most. Yet even in such situations we are reminded that our Father in Heaven has assured us of His love, compassion and protection. In Matthew 6:25-34, Jesus tackles a very important issue that we suffer from and often deal with, namely "Worry". In this passage, He presents and outlines 6 principles worth noting about worrying:

1. Worry is unnecessary.

Even for the hardworking. Nobody works harder for a living than a bird, but birds do not worry. Yet the Heavenly Father looks after them. How much less should you worry?

2. Worry is useless.

Anxious care can not add a single hour to life. The past cannot be changed; the future cannot be charted. So worrying about them is useless and debilitating.

3. Worry is blind.

It refuses to learn the Lessons of God's providence taught us by the birds and flowers. Short-lived as they are, in their quiet dependence on their environment they display that 'peace' that should mark believers who know that behind their environment there is a loving heavenly Father.

4. Worry is essentially a failure to trust God:

For disciples to be of "little faith" (vv.30) hurts God greatly. It means we do not trust Him. It means that we do not put him first, but instead all these things (vv.33) come first. Our ambition or our goal as disciples must be to put God and His righteousness at the top of our list of priorities and we shall find that God takes care of the necessities of life.

5. Worry is Sin:

Worry is faith in fear, not faith in Jesus Christ. Fear is the rejection of faith! The Bible tells us that "God has not given us a spirit of fear but a spirit of power, of love and of sound mind or self discipline" (2 Timothy 1:7).

Rejoice! Revive! Reconcile! Repent! Renew! Release!

6. Worry is a grievous killer:

Worry is the mother of cancer, heart diseases, high blood pressure, and ulcers. It is not what you are eating that kills you, it's what eating you.

Worry has sent very important people to the cemetery long before their time.

Paul wrote to the church of Philippi, in Philippians 4:11-13, "I am not saying this because I am in need, for I have learned to be content whatever the circumstances. I know what it is to be in need, and I know what it is to have plenty. I have learned the secret of being content in any and every situation, whether well fed or hungry, whether living in plenty or in want. I can do everything through him who gives me strength". In I Thessalonians 5:16, Paul says, "Be joyful always; pray continually, give thanks in all circumstances, for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus

Do not worry about tomorrow!

- Don't be anxious about your health because Jesus Christ is still the great physician.
- Don't be anxious about your finances because your Father in heaven is Jehovah Jireh, the Lord who supplies all your needs. Moses told the Israelites that "It is He who gives you power to get wealth" (Duet. 8:18)
- Don't be anxious about your children's future. Because king David said, "I have not seen the righteous forsaken, nor his descendants begging for bread" (Psalm 37:25)


